The Story Behind the Song: Who You Say I Am

"Who You Say I Am" was an incredible privilege to be a part of. I wrote the song with Reuben Morgan who is a great friend, and we have a great history of writing songs together. A couple

of the things we discussed was the fact that there is such a prevalence of people struggling with anxiety and stress. One of the top challenges that young people face is anxiety, over their careers or relationships or specific issues. We wanted to write a song that would speak to that, which is "Be Still." Through that process, we wrote "Who You Say I Am" because we realized that it is so important to understand how God sees us, and what He says about us. It's so important to go to the Scriptures and read who God says we are. The way we show God is determined by the way we know God.

The theme, "Who You Say I Am", is from John 8, which is the truth will set you free. Jesus says, 'who the son sets free, is free indeed.' It's a real declaration of identity. It talks about how a slave has no place in the family. Our identity resides in knowing ourselves in Christ and living within the stability of knowing we are who God says we are.

Based on these scriptures: <u>John 8:36</u> (NIV): "So, if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed." <u>Romans 8:31</u> (NIV): "What, then, shall we say in response to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us?"

John 1:12 (NIV): "Yet to all who did receive Him, to

those who believed in His name, He gave the right to become children of God."

Song takeaway. Once our identity is grounded in Christ, and all that's been accomplished by Jesus, and all that God says about us, everything else becomes peripheral, like our careers. The central truth is that God has called us by name and given us our identities in His family. We hear that phrase, "I am a child of God" so often within our congregations that I believe we start to numb out the meaning of it, and how it applies to our everyday lives.

"Who the Son sets free is free indeed" is a Scripture about freedom and identity. You are a child of God. That can never be threatened or taken from you. As a believer, the truth of this song changes the way I live out my faith. We were passionate to give the church a song that says that God is for them and He thinks the world of them. While everything around you and about you changes, this is the one thing about yourself that will stay constant. You are chosen by a God who loves you deeply. He is a God who is for you and is never against you. He is a God who wants a relationship with you. He is a God who will never let you down.

The theme of the song is, "I am chosen, not forsaken, I am who You say I am." God has chosen us and the fact that we are in a position where we know God and be reconciled to Him. The challenge of the song is the idea that we have been set right because of the comprehensive work of Jesus. You can stand before Him as chosen, and not forsaken. You haven't been left on your own. He is running towards us.




