Contemporary Worship Highlights 2019

When looking back at 2019, I am thankful for so much and humbled at the ways the Lord worked in me, the praise team, and our church. Below are some of the highlights from 2019.

- GBPC's praise team (that will be 20 years old in 2021!) has a name—-Bridge to Worship.
 Bridge to Worship has a logo,
 Facebook page, YouTube channel, and is in process of recording cover and original songs.
- Bridge to Worship prepared and served a dinner for NEST.
- AudioFetch hearing assistance system was installed. We continue to encourage the use of it.
- Bridge to Worship partnered together and published a weekly Lenten devotional video with original video, pho-

tography, and voice recordings. This video series partnered with the music ministry's church-wide devotional, "Awakening to God's Beauty." We also published a daily Advent video with original video, photography, and voice recordings called the "Luke Challenge." The videos are available on our YouTube channel—Bridge to Worship GBPC.

AV support was provided for multiple events outside of Sunday morning worship services—-Ladies' Morning Out, Men's Retreat, Women's Retreat, May 19 Joyful, Joyful concert, candlelight concerts, Fall Kick-off, Trunk or Treat, Who Dun It? Dinner, Christmas Eve Services, and so much more. A big thank you to Ethan Crews and Aaron Dunn who faithfully provided excellence with sound. We also

- have a wonderful team of media volunteers.
- Creation and development of several services outside of Sunday morning worship such as: A Night of Praise and Worship with Hands of Praise Sign Language Team, Service of Healing and Wholeness, Maundy Thursday, VBS Salvation Night, 7:00 PM Christmas Eve Service, etc.
- Nashville Nights was an eight week FBLive session series on Monday nights in the fall to educate and equip Bridge to Worship's musicians (vocalists and instrumentalists).
- Bridge to Worship participated in the 2019 Chesapeake Christmas Parade. Our float, "Joy to the World," was a huge success and a wonderful example of Christian teamwork.

Goal #1: Spiritual Growth—Begin each rehearsal with a devotional based on the scripture for the coming Sunday. Provide daily team devotionals during Advent and Lent. Study Scripture together and continue to deepen our relationship with Jesus Christ.

We received another donation in 2013 to expand the bells and chimes to 5 octaves each.

They are in desperate need of refurbishing. We have received donations to cover the expense. The process involves shipping all of the cases and bells/chimes back to the factory.

Goal #3: Increase our social media presence in creative ways. We are realizing the great need to use social media to share the Good News with others. Our dedicated volunteers are working hard to do this. We will search for ways to support their work.

Children's Ministry Highlights 2019

Our Children's Ministry team and each of our leaders feel their prime mission is to show each of the children and their parents in our church community the love of Christ. Through our events, missions, and regular Sunday and Wednesday classes, our leaders give of their time to be listening ears, mentors, and teachers.

- In early November, we said goodbye to our Director of Youth Ministries, Andrew Marshall, who served in his role at GBPC for seven years. After sending him off with our blessings, a team of staff members led by our pastors stepped in to ensure a smooth transition while we begin a search for a new Director of Youth Ministries.
- Youth Sunday went wonderfully with another "squeeze" service and lots of participation from our students and children.
- Confirmation culminated for our students with a retreat to the mountains for hiking and alone time with God in nature.
 We continue to build this retreat each year to allow students and mentors from previous years to attend.

- Matthew Bitterman and Kaycee Chilton both served this past summer in internship positions. They grew as youth leaders and supported our ministry by helping plan and run VBS, Sunday Morning Club, and Wednesday trips. We're grateful for their service.
- Our High School students continued to serve those in need this summer in D.C. on our Pilgrimage mission trip. Our Middle Schoolers also went on a service trip to Harvest of Hope.
- Students and leaders went both to Nicaragua and Honduras this year to serve those missions.
- Late this fall, we began having Fun Friday events for High School and Middle School students to provide great time to fellowship together and a low-pressure event to invite friends to each month.
- We continue to establish life groups for our students and integrate worship into our regular programming times.

Congregational Care

GBPC has a team of people who provide care to the congregation. Supporting the pastors are our Parish Visitor and four Pastor's Aides who liaison with the Board of Deacons. The primary responsibility of

our deacons is to provide a ministry of compassion, witness, and service to members of the congregation.

GBPC members in Life Groups primarily receive care through the

group leader and the members of the Life Group, people who will best be able to know about and respond to specific needs in the lives of members and their families.

Deacons

The ministry of deacons is one of compassion, witness, and service, sharing Jesus Christ's redeeming love. There are three, three year Deacon Class terms, each with seven deacons per Class Term. Each deacon is blessed with shepherding their flock of GBPC congregation members, who are not in one of our many *Life Groups*. Shepherding and supporting our flocks is one of the most important and most rewarding deacon assignments. Deacons are responsible for our flock families to keep them informed, to check with them for prayer requests, to make ourselves available for help supporting our flock in their toughest trials and celebrate with them in their joyous times.

Deacons are blessed with being a prayer partner with our flock members and we are here to pray with them, for them, and for their family. We ask our flocks to allow us to be their initial contact to assist them in the event a flock member should have a physical, emotional, or spiritual need. Deacons make home visits, hospital visits, talk over the phone, by e-mail, or whatever our flock members need may be. Deacons do our very best to make ourselves available should a flock member need us. All conversations are not shared with anyone else without their permission. We ask our flock member if we have their permission to include them in our *Prayer Covenant* and if so, we inform the Pastors Aides and Tonia, who does the actual inclusion. We can also request initiation of our *Prayer Chain* for emergency needs. Through our *Prayer Chain*, almost instantly, through email and phone calls, dozens of deacons and church staff will be praying for God's intervention in the emergency.

Deacons receive an advanced copy of our *Prayer Covenant* each Friday and look to see if any of our flock are included. We then contact our flock member in need and listen to them with compassion and empathy and ask how we can help. We help our flock member in need and if their need is beyond our capability we put them in contact with the GBPC ministry that can help them. For extreme needs and for monetary help we contact one of our Pastors for their help or to request we provide funding from our *Second Mile Fund*.

Through deacons coordination with the *Sanctuary Flower Ministry* and the *Prayer Shawl Ministry*, each Sunday deacons bring their flock members listed in the *Prayer Covenant* a bouquet of sanctuary flowers and usually a prayer shawl, prayer throw, baby blanket, or prayer cloth. We always ask if we can pray with our flock gift recipient before we leave.

Deacons regularly send cards and letters to our flocks and close by encouraging our flock to share with us what is going on in their lives, including both events to celebrate and problems they need help with. Deacons especially reach out to our senior members and ask if they have additional needs the church can help with, such as projects around the house or needing rides to appointments. We enclose a deacon business card with magnetic backing to adhere to their refrigerator as a reminder to call us first when a need arises.

Deacons prepare Holy Communion and clean up after communion. Deacons are so blessed with helping serve Holy Communion, which is a beautiful, spiritual experience of sensing being united with God and being one with each person receiving Holy Communion.

Deacons meet the first Tuesday of each month. For our continuing education, at each meeting, a guest speaker from one our Ministries is invited to give a presentation to the deacons about the resources available for our flocks through their specific ministry. Also, a deacon representative is present at each monthly *Session Meeting*.

Deacon goals for 2020 remain the same as described for 2019.

- Live and serve meals to an average of 60 people. We also provide coffee and breakfast items for Sunday morning Fellowship Connections. A special reception was held after the Lessons and Carols service which was well attended.
- There were two New Member classes held in April and October in which the hospitality team served lunch.
- The Welcome Desk has five new volunteers to answer questions, pass out information on programs in the church and act as door greeters.
- The Hospitality Team purchased a new stove and brand new clothes dryer which was greatly needed.
- A new coffee/tea station is now in place in the fellowship hall.

Outreach Team Highlights

Our mission is to create ways to share Christ and the ministries of GBPC "beyond the walls." We had a BBQ judging contest, as well as potato salad judging and plenty of family fun kid's activities and music. This event was a huge success in bringing folks back to church.

We also assisted in setting up the Ice Cream Welcome Social for the Nieto Family. We created and donated several give-a-way baskets for the Trunk or Treat Event at GBPC.



Stewardship Highlights 2019

In 2019, we budgeted a deficit for the year of (\$75,000) to cover the one-time costs for the PNC team and overlap of the pastors' salaries during the transition. The good news, we only ended the year with a (\$36,886) deficit. Despite falling short of our top line budget of \$1,400,000 by (\$39,739), we had \$78,071 in expense savings for the year versus the budget. All of our ministries did an excellent job managing expenses and we had some significant payroll and benefits savings versus the budget. As a church, we continue to be debtfree and self-fund our capital needs. In 2019, we added \$83,142 by way of general fund giving and direct offering to the building fund.

Our goal for the Fall Stewardship

campaign was 200 pledges for \$1,000,000. So far, we have received 177 pledges for \$874,750.

We would like to thank our volunteer auditors Dee Kloskin and Jim Sterling for 2019, headed up by Laura Belcher, who compiled the review of our accounting records in accordance with requirements in the *Book of Order*. Also in 2019, Lisa Winslow and Debbie Acors performed a review of the Preschool books for the period ended 6/30/18. In addition, we continue to have faithful and dedicated counters who volunteer to come on Monday mornings to count and reconcile our offerings.

We continue to invest a portion of our longer-term funds into CDs to

earn a better rate of return on our assets. As of 12/31/19, we had approximately \$174,350 invested and earned \$6,083 in total interest income in 2019 compared to only \$1,359 in 2018. We also received dividends on our stock investment. The market value of the Church's stock at 12/31/19 was \$12,460.

We continue our normal responsibilities of overseeing the payment of bills, the counting of weekly offerings, preparing the annual budget, informing Session monthly as to the status of the church's financial matters, and other various duties. We thank you for the opportunity to serve God through this committee and please pray that we continue to provide sound, faithbased financial judgment.



Service & Mission Highlights 2019

GBPC continues to provide a multitude of outreach and service opportunities that help support and assist countless numbers of individuals, families, schools, and organizations, both locally and internationally. Our church body is blessed to have so many members who truly love to serve, give, share, and show compassion to others. Because of this, we have been able to respond to a broad spectrum of needs that arise throughout the year.

The overall theme for Service and Missions is "Beyond the Walls."

Our goals are to serve the members of our church, our community and beyond. We seek to use the gifts given to us all and go beyond the sanctuary to reach others with our time, talents and resources. Once again, we were blessed to exceed each of these areas this year.

The Service and Mission budget for 2019 was \$213,150, which was allocated to many different local, stateside and international missions throughout the year. With additional funding from our members, we were able to easily serve those within our budget as well as gift

others with the many blessings donated to us.

GBPC is known throughout our area as one who gives back to our community.

We truly are a congregation who serves "Beyond The Walls" as well as continuing to teach, grow and worship from within.

Christmas Angel Tree Project In December, our Angel Tree blessed multiple families and children through the PIN Ministry. God moved and touched many GBPC families' hearts to give, as there were even five bikes donated!

Finding Hope Honduras GBPC financially supports this ministry started by former church member Katlyn McConnell. Finding Hope works with women on a micro business project to promote self-sufficiency as well as a feeding

program for children. GBPC gave \$6000. We also sent a team to Honduras to work on a new building.

Hearts for Honduras This outreach helps offset costs for caring for the children of *Finding Hope*. The families and the Center struggle to provide for the needs of the children. For \$1 per day, GBPC provides these children daily needs. This is an investment into the lives of children, making a positive impact on the quality of their lives and able to have a personal connection directly with the children and staff.

Jingle Jog 5K 10th Annual Jingle Jog was held in December. 235 participants registered for the combined 5K and 1 mile events. Participants ranged in age from 4 to 80 years old. The overall winner crossed the finish line in 18:46. Our event sponsors were:

Operation Christmas Child GBPC sent 298 Christmas boxes this year. Our boxes made their way to Mexico and Uruguay.

Parents in Need Outreach GBPC supports this ministry both financially and with volunteers.

Tree of Lives GBPC donated \$5,000 to this ministry, which supports the Joy Village, an orphanage in Kenya, for children who are abandoned and living with HIV/AIDS.

Valentine Boxes of Love Presbyterian Women coordinate this outreach by collecting donations of candy, treats, and special notes of encouragement to be sent in care packages to college students and military members serving overseas.

VBS Mission Project This year we supported *Finding Hope*. Our children brought in supplies for the children's center and raised over \$2400.

Young Life Chesapeake GBPC donated \$5,000 to this ministry which focuses on sharing Christ with teens from our local area schools.

Vida Joven Missionary Support Nicaragua GBPC donated \$3,500 to help support several Nicaraguan VJ leaders in both Rivas and Matagalpa, Nicaragua

Community Outreach

AARP Church members volunteer with free tax preparation. Hosted at GBPC for two days a week for 10 weeks, our volunteers completed over 1,070 tax returns. In addition, volunteers provided snacks, coffee, and fellowship to those waiting to be served.

Burfoot House A transitional home and comprehensive program designed for homeless single women to achieve selfsufficiency. Volunteers help with weekly mentoring, financial literacy classes, life skills, professional development, bible study, the creative arts, transportation, and case management.

Christmas "Adopt a Family" GBPC members adopted 10 families, providing Christmas gifts for their children. Families that were assisted came from Camelot Elementary, PIN ministry, GBPC, and the community.

Family Outreach GBPC supports many individuals and families in the community with clothes, and other needed items from the many donations given by church members. We have had the privilege of helping several families get established in new apartments with furniture, repairing automobiles, helping with medical bills, electric bills, rent and many other needs.

Helping Hands Ministry GBPC volunteers help with home repairs, yard clean-up, and moving assistance for church members and individuals in the community. This year, volunteers made repairs to the home of a single person suffering with cancer.

Health Related Missions

AIDS/Hospice Meals Each month, PW Circle groups and small groups met in the kitchen to prepare meals that are given to the AC-CESS AIDS Center, which help feed those living with HIV/AIDS. This year, the groups prepared and donated over 1,100 meals to the Center.

ARC Blood Drive The Men's Saturday morning bible study group hosted two blood drives this year for the American Red Cross. Volunteers from GBPC helped with

staffing the drives, which produced over 80 pints of blood.

Cancer Care Foundation GBPC volunteers support this outpatient treatment cancer center by providing lunches and snacks for the patients receiving treatments. The volunteers deliver the lunches directly to the patients, and offer words of encouragement during their visits.

Chesapeake Free Care Clinic GBPC donated \$2,000 towards this organization, which provides free dental

and medical care to residents of Chesapeake who cannot afford insurance and medical care. Several members of GBPC volunteer and/or are on staff at the Clinic.

Tidewater Pastoral Counseling GBPC donated funding to this agency, which offers counseling services at a sliding scale fee to those who cannot afford to pay or do not have insurance. GBPC is one of the host sites for their counseling services, and has counselors on site at GBPC one day a week.

Food Related Missions

Backpack Program GBPC supports 75 students at Camelot Elementary School by sending food kits home on the weekends. Many assist with set up, packing the meals, and delivery each month.

Food Closet GBPC collects canned food throughout the year and volunteers deliver to local food pantries. In addition, GBPC hands out "to go bags" to "walk ins" looking for assistance.

Food for All & Operation Tons of Love The Music Ministry organized food drives to support the Food Bank of Southeastern Virginia, In 2019, GBPC collected 1,843 lbs. of food in February and 1,393 lbs. in September.

Garden Ministry Our gardeners grow vegetables that are delivered to Plant-A-Row, which

in turn delivers to the House of Blessings Food Pantry. The garden produced over 687 pounds donated veggies. More than a dozen gardeners helped this year.

Rise Against Hunger GBPC hosted two Rise Against Hunger events in March and August, with 80–100 volunteers at each event. We packaged approximately 33,000 meals in 2019 to be sent around the world.

Thanksgiving Food Our congregation donated to the following schools:

- 30 dinners to Camelot
- 10 dinners to BM Williams
- 16 dinners to Great Bridge Primary
- 4 dinners to the school board building.

We took 400 pounds of food to the Food Closet at Prince of Peace Church.



Homeless & Housing Related Missions

CAST Chesapeake Area Shelter Team GBPC hosted the shelter program for one week with an average of 46 guests per night. Dinner, breakfast, and sack lunches were provided to all guests. We offered additional services such as haircuts, blood sugar screening, flu shots, a therapy dog, bible study, music performances, and prayer. We have approximately 150 volunteers that assisted during the week.

Faith Works Coalition GBPC donated \$1,000. Local churches work on repairs to homes of needy individuals. Donated funds purchase supplies for repairs. All of the labor is provided for free. We have a few church members who have participated in the work days.

For Kids Inc GBPC supports this organization with funding and volunteers that assist with several projects.

- Hosting their end of school year summer picnic providing all of the food and activities for the 100+ kids and families.
- Hosted "Beyond the Bell" in our building for 4 weeks. Volunteers assisted with tutoring and lunches.

NEST Norfolk Emergency Shelter Team GBPC housed approximately 50 guests each night for one week in March. We provided two meals a



day, a bagged lunch, and prayer. Two hundred volunteers helped to make meals, serve food, provide fellowship, entertainment, drive the bus, make sack lunches and to stay overnight with guests.

Incarcerated Related Missions

Chesapeake Jail Ministry GBPC donated \$2,000 towards this local jail ministry, which seeks to share the gospel message of Christ to the incarcerated, through Bible study and biblical teaching.

Kairos Prison Ministry Several church members travel to Greensville Correctional Facility to facilitate Bible study and to help host two weekend retreats. Our church members supplied baked cookies, decorative handmade placemats, and cards of encouragement to the incarcerated men who participate in the weekend retreat.



Evangelistic & Disciple-Making Missions

Glad Tidings India GBPC donated funding which enabled the message of Christ to groups in India who have never heard the gospel message.

Middle East Missionary Support GBPC financially supports a missionary family that resides in the Middle East, working to share the message of Christ with those who are of a predominately Muslim community.

CRU Financial support is given to missionaries Matt and Anna Shenk in Richmond, VA working with local churches to address the needs of the city.

ODU Presbyterian Student Union GBPC hosts dinners and bible study with the students once a month. We also donate funding to help sustain this ministry on the campus.

Presbytery, Synod of Eastern Virginia GBPC donated \$53,000 to the Presbytery to support its programs.

Mission Trips 2019

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Mission Trip: October 2019

The team was hosted at C Stone church along with 2 other teams from Cincinnati, OH and Pelham, MA. We were introduced to the Fuller Center Disaster Rebuilder Team at the orientation dinner. We met Heather Tucker, who along with her husband, Bart, started FCDR. Our project assignment was to demo and rebuild a house that was flooded by 4 ft. of water. The owner was a 75 year woman who had a stroke following the hurricane, requiring her to undergo prolonged rehabilitation and now uses a wheelchair. Her home had to be modified to accommodate the wheelchair. Daily work accomplishments:

- The interior of the home was removed of cabinetry, demolished to the studs, sub flooring.
- The windows were removed and rotten wood replaced.

- Electrical outlet boxes throughout the house were moved to code height.
- Repair of the flooring continued and subflooring was completed.
- Outside wall rotten wood was replaced.
- Insulation and dry wall was installed where no electrical wiring was located to allow for electrical inspection.
- The new luxury vinyl flooring was laid down in the smaller bedroom.
- Insulation and dry wall installed.
- Electrical work completed.

FCDR does a daily devotional at dinner called the *Face of God*. It is a time of sharing where you saw God in your day. There were many touching moments.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Mission Trip: December 2019

The team was hosted at C Stone church. Our project was to continue to rebuild the house we worked on in October. The owner, Ms Frances had not seen her home since being rescued at the time of the hurricane in September of 2018, as she continued her rehabilitation for a stroke which occurred after her rescue. On the first day, the team was divided. Half of our team worked at the Ruth house and the other half went to a Habitat for Humanity house referred to Fuller Disaster Rebuilders. Demolition was started in the kitchen and bathroom; however, pest infestation, suspected drug dealing, and weapons was reported. For our team's safety we would did not return to that location. Beginning day two, all GBPC team members served at the same location. We were able to complete the home we assisted with in October. The highlight of our mission trip was the home dedication when we met Ms. Frances for the first time and she saw her rebuilt home. The home that had once been enclosed in small rooms was now one open living space with handicapped adapted doors and bathroom. A new ramp and front porched allowed her easy ingress and egress with a place to enjoy the outdoors.

Finding Hope, Honduras Mission Trip: October 2019

GBPC sent a team of 13 participants on a mission trip to Honduras to support the Finding Hope ministry. The ministry has purchased a new plot of land and our mission team was able to help with the construction of a retaining wall and bridge on a new piece of property. We also held a VBS for the children where we taught bible lessons, played games, had craft projects and were able to teach the kids how to play handbells. The GPBC music ministry donated a set of handbells to Finding Hope. In the evenings, we had a devotion time with our team, along with some of the Finding Hope leaders. We cooked a traditional American Picnic Dinner meal for all the Finding Hope staff and their families and had a night of celebration together.



Vida Joven Nicaragua Mission Trip: August 2019

A GBPC team of 30 traveled to Vida Joven Camp in August, 2019. Twelve "first timers" went to La Finca in central Nicaragua. We spent the week working on various camp maintenance projects including planting 500 plants. Mary Hammel donated the plants to help with soil erosion and beautification of the camp. Our 16 plus year relationship with the Vida Joven mission in Nicaragua was strengthen as the team got to talk to Young Life campers that had accepted Jesus at camp. We also got to participate in leading activities at a local Young Life Club
