Postlude I've Got Peace Like a River

The writer of the hymn text, It is Well with My Soul, Horatio G. Spafford, was a successful lawyer and business man in Chicago with a wife and five children. They were not strangers to tragedy. They lost a son to pneumonia and their business to the great Chicago fire. Yet, the business did flourish once again. In 1873 the French ocean liner, Ville du Havre was crossing the Atlantic from the US to Europe with 313 passengers on board, including Spafford's wife and four daughters, but Horatio had to stay in Chicago with plans to join his family later. The ship was struck by another ship and only Spafford's wife was saved. Booking passage on the next available ship to join his grieving wife, about four days out, the captain let Spafford know they were over the place where his children perished. Horatio wrote "It Is Well with my Soul" while on the journey to reach his wife.
