

Sir Edward Elgar

We honor our graduating seniors today and congratulate them on their achievements. Traditionally, the music played at graduations is "Pomp and Circumstance", composed by Sir Edward Elgar in 1901. This orchestral piece is part of a larger work called "Pomp and Circumstance in D Major, Op. 39, No. 1." Sir Edward Elgar was given an honorary doctorate from Yale and the school played his "Pomp and Circumstance" as a recessional at the ceremony. After that other colleges adopted the song and soon it just became tradition but as a processional instead of a recessional.
