***Worship and Music notes:*** We honor the life and legacy of Hal H. Hopson today in our worship service. Hal H. Hopson (1933-2025) was welcomed into heaven, Sunday, July 20. He was a full-time composer and church-musician and known the world over for his contributions to church music that spanned every form of music with over 3,000 published works. He was still composing until very recently. Hal visited Great Bridge Presbyterian in 2000 with the Virginia Wesleyan Sacred Music Conference in a worship service that premiered, “A Festival of Hymns: The Writers Tell Their Stories.” All the music for worship today was composed or arranged by Hal. The hymn, “How Lovely, Lord”, a setting of Psalm 84, is named MERLE’S TUNE for his sister, Merle. The choir commissioned Hal to compose an anthem in 2009 on the occasion of my 15th anniversary. It has since been published, now available to everyone. In 2012, he published a collection of three solos. I am humbled that one is dedicated to me. This solo is the offertory for today. On a personal note, Hal and Martha Hopson have been friends with Rusty and me for decades. He played for our wedding at Westminster Presbyterian Church in Nashville, Tennessee. His cantata, God With Us, was one of the few compositions selected by a panel at the Kennedy Space Center, Washington, DC, to be placed in a capsule during the American Bicentennial in 1976. The capsule will be opened at the Tricentennial in 2076 and will be heard again as a representative piece of American choral composition of this century. Rusty and I sang the premiere of this work in Nashville, TN, at Vine Street Christian Church. We pray for his wife, Martha, their children, Maria, Carol and John and their families at this difficult time.
